

## Poster Presentation Guidelines

### 1. Eligibility

Participation is restricted to postgraduate students currently enrolled in the MEd or MPhil or PhD in Education programmes at the Faculty of Graduate Studies, University of Jaffna.

### 2. Technical Specifications

All posters must adhere to the following:

- **Size:** Standard **A0 Size:** 84.1 cm or 33.1” (Width) x 118.9 cm or 46.8” (Height).
- **Orientation:** Vertical
- **Layout:** Content should be readable from 1.5 metres. Use a minimum font size of 24pt for body text and 48pt for headings.

### 3. Content Requirements

Posters should be structured logically, including:

1. Title and Authors
2. Problem Statement
3. Objectives/Research Questions
4. Methodology
5. Findings
6. Conclusion

### 4. Submission and Approval Process

A colour printout of the poster on an A4 sheet, along with the duly completed Poster Presentation Consent Form, must be submitted with the respective supervisor(s)'s recommendation on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> of June 2026 via email: [editorirce@univ.jfn.ac.lk](mailto:editorirce@univ.jfn.ac.lk)

## **5. Registration Deadline**

Candidates who received the recommendations from the supervisor(s) for the postal presentation must complete their conference registration by 20 June 2026.

## **6. Presentation and Certification**

- Presenters are required to mount their posters on the 17<sup>th</sup> of July between 9 am and 2 pm in the allocated area for poster presentation.
- Presenters must be stationed by their posters on the conference day, 18th of July 2026, from 11.30 am to 1.30 pm for evaluation and discussion.
- Certificate of Poster Presentation will be awarded to the registered presenter.
- A “best poster Award” will be awarded based on visual clarity, research impact, and the presenter’s ability to explain the study.
